Course Descriptions:

INTRODUCTION TO THE DOCUMENTARY

A one semester course presenting a brief historical overview of non-fiction film. This course also gives each student the opportunity to conceive, research, develop, write and produce a short super 8mm documentary film. Production techniques unique to non-fiction film are discussed, but students are expected to have some basic technical skills. Throughout the course, films are shown to illustrate various styles of the documentary and to provide historical perspective.

A trans-disciplinary production class that engages students in the exploration of social and humanitarian issues. PRODUCTION: 290 - VISUAL COMMUNICATION

This is an introductory production class in which each student produces five short films. Throughout the course, students learn about developing ideas, clarity, character, dramatic values, scope and structure.

Students are introduced to different approaches to the documentary, explore a variety of research methods, use a broad range of resources and seek their own approach and style appropriate to their chosen subject. Similarities and differences between writing a narrative script and a documentary treatment are also discussed.
